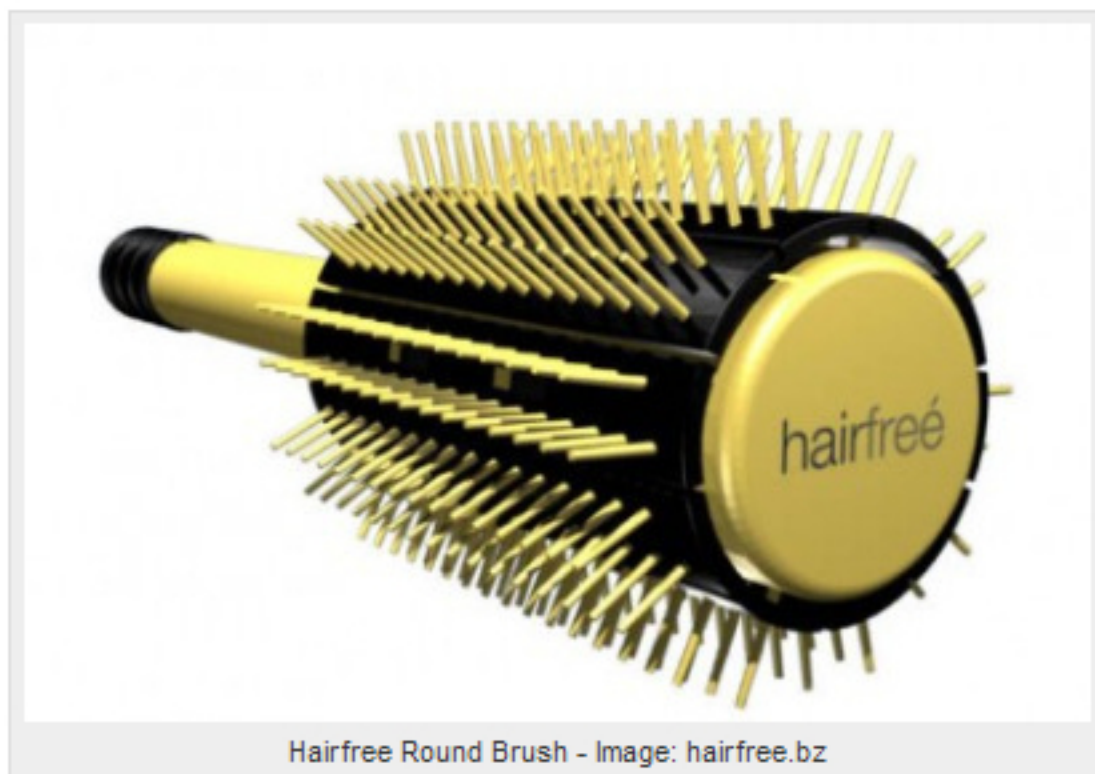
Hairfree Brushes

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Don't you hate cleaning out your [hairbrush](#)? A while back I was introduced to [hairfree™ self-cleaning hairbrushes](#). This line of brushes is very unique. You simply slide up a button and push all the [hair](#) out of it. It's much cleaner and easier than a traditional hairbrush.

A cool feature of these brushes is that you can convert each one to a vent brush by adjusting a knob. With a vent brush, you can speed up the blow drying process. Another big plus is this line of brushes can pretty much replace your flat iron and curling iron. Because hairfree brushes are made with ceramic coated plates, you can get similar styling results with the brush and a blow dryer. Flat irons often heat up to over 400 degrees. Anything you can do to avoid that much heat on your hair is a good thing.

You can order hairfree™ brushes online for \$15.95 for the round brush and \$9.95 for the flat brush. The shipping and handling is a little steep at \$3.75 and \$3.25 respectively. Yet their FAQ section says "Shipping, handling and tax is included in the price for all orders placed within the United States." If you are going to place your order, I would recommend contacting them first to make sure you aren't going to get overcharged for the s/h charges. They have an email address and phone number on the contact page of their website, [hairfree.bz](#). If you are a [salon](#) owner, they also sell in bulk.

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
